also noted Sophie Koerner's contributions in establishing kindergarten classes for young students.

Illinois State Representative Tom Holbrook discussed the Koerner and Engelmann legacy in southwest Illinois. Representative Holbrook obtained state funds that allowed the City of Belleville to purchase the Koerner home so it could be restored. Holbrook and St. Clair County Board Chairman Mark Kern have worked together to purchase the Engelmann farm near Shiloh for use as a park. The Koerner and Engelmann properties may be used to interpret the impact of German immigrants on the area's cultural and economic development.

Engelmann family descendent Mary Armstrong presented Koerner Rombauer with an Engelmann family ancestral wine bottle dating to the 1830's.

Koerner House Restoration Committee member Jim Ettling was on the mend and unable to attend but made sure a cake, in the form of the Koerner house, was part of the special occasion.

On Saturday, November 21, descendents gathered at Walnut Hill cemetery for the planting of a commemorative tree at the Koerner family gravesite. Nurseryman Bob Dintelmann came out of retirement to oversee the planting.

The group then toured the Koerner house and received an update on stabilization repairs, interior demolition work, and reviewed overall plans for the

The party was then taken to a reception hosted by the downtown Belleville law firm of Mathis, Marifian, Richter and Grandy where Wolfgang Stueken presented a slide show of Koerner's German birthplace and Rombauer wines once again produced their "gemutlich" glow.
